Medical Management of Spasticity

Introduction

This leaflet has been put together by the Ward 5 Rehabilitation Unit to give to patients who are considering medical management of their spasticity.

This leaflet will focus on the medical management of spasticity via Botulinum toxin injection and will hopefully answer any questions you may have. If you are experiencing symptoms of spasticity, you will already be participating in a multidisciplinary management programme.

No patient is the same and this also applies to their spasticity management. Your rehabilitation team along with your Consultant will discuss your case at length before suggesting a management plan.

Following a period of assessment, your team may advise that you consider medication via local injection. This is commonly known as Botulinum toxin and can complement your existing treatment plan.

What does this process involve?

You will need to meet with the doctor or appropriate professional who will be prescribing the medication.

They'll want to fully understand your medical history and reasons for wanting the treatment. This assessment will help to identify your goals for the treatment. The professional will then discuss in length the proposed treatment plan.

You may be familiar with the word Botulinum toxin, it is used to treat a variety of conditions and can often referred to as Botox.

What are the benefits of local injection

Botulinum toxin injections are now recognised as the first line of treatment in the management of localised spasticity.

This local injection aims to relax the affected muscles and aid symptom relief of your presenting problem.

It is a prescription-only medicine that should only be prescribed and given by an appropriately trained healthcare professional, such as a doctor or a medical prescriber.

Local anaesthetic isn't usually needed. Your skin is cleaned and small amounts of botulinum toxin are injected into the muscles identified as requiring treatment. It takes about 10 minutes. The injections may be a little painful. Most people tolerate the discomfort well.

What are the risks and side effects associated with injection?

Some people can experience; bleeding, pain or bruising at the injection site.

Medications have the potential to cause side effects, but not everyone will experience them.

Some people can experience a rash or temporary muscle weakness. Some may also experience flu like symptoms.

In some rare cases, swallowing problems have also been noted.

If you experience any side effects, they may subside over time or if concerned please seek medical attention.

What will happen if I decide not to have the treatment?

If you decide not to have the proposed treatment, you may continue with your current management plan. Alternative options may be also offered.

Each individual case is unique and therefore your treating team will discuss personalised options with you in more detail.

y alternative treatments options are as follows:									

When will you see improvement?

You may not see any difference straight away. It can take about three to five days before the injections take effect, and often three weeks for the full effect to be seen.

The effects generally last for about twelve weeks. However your treating professional will review your progress and determine jointly with yourself the future treatment plan.

Please use the below line to record your symptom relief post injection

Rating your symptom relief from 0-10 (0 representing not effective and 10 beneficial)

This information can be used as a discussion point in your next follow up session.

Optimising medical management

The toxin is only licenced to be given every 12 weeks. Some people may only need one course of injections, while others may benefit from a repeated course. This will be discussed as part of your consultation.

In addition to the injection, often advice and education may be given by the treating team. This can include advice on positioning, stretches and exercise in order to optimise the treatment. This will be discussed during your consultation.

What follow up will I receive?

Your treating team will review your progress and determine jointly with yourself the future treatment plan. This will occur at your follow-up consultation appointment and this will be discussed accordingly with the professional prescribing the medication.

Feedback

Your feedback is important to us and helps us influence care in the future.
