

Patients with diet, tablet or GLP - 1 controlled diabetes mellitus (who do not take insulin) undergoing surgical procedures

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Many procedures require that you fast for several hours beforehand. This is sometimes related to the procedure itself or it is required so that you can have a general anaesthetic.

This leaflet is to give you advice on how your diabetes will be managed for the procedure, and is designed for patients who are not on Insulin. If you take insulinplease let the team looking after you know immediately.

For patients having their procedure in the morning

The day before the procedure

- Eat and drink as you would do normally on the day before the procedure, unless advised otherwise.
- Take all your normal diabetes medication the day before the procedure.
- Do not eat or drink anything after midnight.

The day of the procedure

- Do not have your breakfast or eat or drink anything else. Do not take any of your diabetes medication.
- Come to hospital, bringing all your normal medication with you. The surgical team will check your blood glucose.

Occasionally, if it is high they may start an insulin drip.

Otherwise they will monitor your blood glucose every hour until the procedure is over.

After the procedure

Once you are eating and drinking as normal, you can start to take all your normal medication again.

For patients having their procedure in the afternoon

The day before the procedure.

- Eat and drink as you would do normally on the day before the procedure, unless advised otherwise.
- Take all your normal diabetes medication the day before the procedure.

The day of the procedure

- 3. Have a light breakfast.
- Do not eat or drink anything else.
 Do not take any of your diabetes medication.
- Come to hospital, bringing all your normal medication with you. The surgical team will check your blood glucose.

Occasionally, if it is high they may start an insulin drip.

Otherwise they will monitor you blood glucose every hour until the procedure is over.

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After the procedure

Once you are eating and drinking as normal, you can start to take all your normal medication again
