 Introduction You have had a biliary drainage catheter inserted as you have a blockage, injury or are awaiting surgery to your bile duct. This will be left in place until your doctor feels it can be removed or replaced. General care of drain at home A little pain is normal the first week. Do not pull on the catheter. Wear loose clothes. Secure catheter to your clothes using a safety pin or tuck catheter into your clothes. Empty your drainage bag before it is full to prevent it from pulling out. Record the amount of bile you are emptying You should not swim, take a bath, or sit in a hot tub – submerging entry site in water may cause infection You may sponge bathe or shower. It is OK to get the biliary tube site wet. 	 Cleaning the skin around your biliary tube Wash your hands. Remove your old dressing (if using). Clean the skin around your catheter every one to two days with mild soap and water. You may use a cotton swab, gauze, or wash gently while showering. Apply a new dressing (if using). Wash your hands. When should I call for help? If you develop redness, soreness, swelling, or pus at insertion site. if pain worsens or persists If drain stops draining If your tube begins to leak at the insertion site. If your tube becomes dislodged, or sutures fall out try to secure tubing to prevent it falling out and seek help. If your tube falls out, don't panic, cover with dressing and seek medical advice. If you develop chills and/or a temperature > 38.5 °C (If tube capped attach drainage bag) call the number(s) below. If you develop severe or uncontrolled pain please contact your GP or go to A&E.
