Cortisol Day Curve in People with Cushing's Syndrome

Diabetes and Endocrinology Speciality

Why do I need this test?

- This test is performed to assess the control of Cushing's disease whilst you are on medications such as Metyrapone and other drugs.
- This test may also be performed sometimes to assess the average cortisol level in your blood after you have had surgery for Cushing's disease.

Are there any risks or side effects?

No major side effects related to the test as such.

What will happen if I decide not to have this investigation?

You need to discuss the implications of not having the test with your doctor in the endocrine clinic

What do I need to do before the test?

- You do not need to fast before the test
- Please arrive to the unit as early as possible as instructed, ideally by 9am so that we can start the test as early as possible to ensure there is enough time to complete the test.

What happens during the test?

- On the day of your test a nurse will check your details and explain the test to you. You will be on the ward for about eight to nine hours.
- A nurse will put a small tube (cannula) into your vein, blood samples will be taken through this tube. This means you will not have to have lots of needles.
- You will be given the metyrapone or any other medication for Cushing's disease at usual times.
- A nurse will note down the time and the dose of the medication given.
- Blood samples will be taken for the cortisol (steroid) level three hourly for almost nine hours.
- The cannula will then be taken out and you will be able to go home straight away.

What will happen after the test?

- Once you have completed the test, the results will be reviewed by endocrine doctors and they will contact you directly if necessary.
- Further investigation and management will be discussed in the endocrine clinic.
